## Existing Facility Safety:



Single point of access during the day (all other doors locked)



Two ALICE drills annually

# Facility Safety New for 2022-23:

- Six schools equipped with key card access.
  - Automated locking
  - Logged access
  - Panic lock feature
- Work Order increased priority.
  - Doors latch when closed
  - Doors lock when latched



# Facility Safety New for 2022-23:

## **Elementary Schools & K-8**

- Locked single point of entry
- Call to get in during school day
- Four ALICE drills annually – two per semester (one training, one active)

## **K-12 Schools**

- Four ALICE drills annually – two per semester (one training, one active)

## **Middle / High Schools**

- Four ALICE drills annually – two per semester (one training, one active)

# Behavior Threat Assessment Training

- Takes place with students who may present a threat to the school community
- A team approach at site level with a team review at District Office
- Annual training on this process

# District Photo ID Worn by All Employees

- All employees will be required to wear a photo ID throughout the day



# Law Enforcement

- Ensure local law enforcement is involved with our building level ALICE Trainings
- Ensure that all administrators have established connections with local law enforcement

# Social Emotional Development

- Sources of Strength
- Every student having a positive connection with a staff member in our schools
- Restorative Practices
- School Counselors and School Psychologists

# More safety measures that could be implemented:

- Locked single point of entry for K-12, Middle & High Schools – could allow to be unlocked during lunch
- Closed campus
- Additional schools equipped with key card access – Funding and supply chain sets schedule
- KMS safety remodel included in 2022 bond initiative
