

#### IV. STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

##### B. Student Requirements for Participation in Interscholastic Activities

~~Non-KPBSD School Participation.~~ **Non-KPBSD School Participation** Only students enrolled in the public schools of the KPBSD may participate in the Borough team sports tournaments. This includes students enrolled in the Connections Program. A non-KPBSD school on the Kenai Peninsula, having membership in ASAA at the high school level, may participate in middle school level borough tournaments, given the school has registered to do so prior to the season, has participated during the season in accordance with KPSAA Middle School Handbook Guidelines **Activity Rules**, and the school is willing to accept an equal share of tournament expenses.

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**IX. ACTIVITY RULES**  
**BASKETBALL**  
**(Boys and Girls)**

E. Small School Borough Tournaments shall be single elimination with a consolation bracket, thereby guaranteeing each team at least two games.

F. **Classifications** Team classifications are sixth, seventh, and eighth grade boys and sixth, seventh, and eighth grade girls that currently attend the school; or charter school sixth, seventh, and eighth graders.

**XIII. ACTIVITY RULES**  
**SOCCER**  
**(Boys and Girls)**

**A. Classifications.**

- a. A teams will consist of either all boys or all girls.
- b. B teams and small school teams are co-ed.
- c. Team classifications are sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students that currently attend the school; or charter school sixth, seventh, and eighth graders.

VOLLEYBALL**

- C. **Classifications.** Team classifications are sixth, seventh, and eighth grade boys and sixth, seventh, and eighth grade girls that currently attend the school; or charter school sixth, seventh, and eighth graders. ~~Team classifications are seventh/eighth grade girls.~~
- D. **Co-ed:** Small schools playing a co-ed team against a girls' team may only have a maximum of one boy on the court at a time and the boy must serve underhand. Mixed six teams may consist of no more than three boys when playing another mixed six team. Teams that are co-ed and must have more than one boy on the court to field a team will forfeit all matches when playing against all girls teams.
- E. **Small School Borough Tournaments shall be single elimination with a consolation bracket, thereby guaranteeing each team at least two games.**

**XVI. ACTIVITY RULES  
WRESTLING**

**B. Exceptions to rules**

1. A match will consist of three rounds of one and one-half minutes each.
2. A wrestler is allotted a total of two pounds (one (1) pound on the first Monday in February, and one (1) pound on the first Monday in March) for growth purposes and also for maintaining the right to remain in the same weight class.
3. A wrestler can move up one weight **above what they weighed in** at the Borough Tournament regardless of the number of matches at that weight.

**C. Classifications.** Wrestlers will compete in the following weight divisions: 75 and under, 80, 85, 90, 95, 100, 105, 110, 115, 120, 125, 132, 138, 145, 155, 167, 190, and unlimited.

**D. Weigh-in.** Initial weigh-in must be recorded by the coach, and all records must be on file in the principal's office prior to the start of the **athlete's** first scheduled event. ~~This weigh-in places the wrestler in his certified minimum weight class. The wrestler may wrestle up from this weight, but not wrestle down.~~ **A wrestler may only drop one weight class below this initial weigh-in.**
