This has been for a variety of reasons but ultimately many families do not feel supported or heard in the current school model or the district for that matter. We believe this is due to a breakdown in partnership between the school and the community.

We also do not feel that the current school model reflects the community values nor does it model our Alaskan ways of life. In the most recent Nikolaevsk City Council Meeting it was proposed and accepted at that meeting to move forward with advocating for a charter school model using the existing school building. We believe the building is in good working order and provides the space for this opportunity.

Nikolaevsk is considered a Russian Orthodox community and we would like to invest in the larger community culture of Nikolaevsk by offering our children a school that represents the home values so many of our families or neighbors have. The current school model does not reflect the opportunity for our families who engage in Russian Orthodox beliefs and holidays to sustain a traditional education due to cultural practices that would prevent a student from
