Curriculum



International Baccalaureate will be the core curriculum for the school

Primary- Russian Immersion - The morning will be spent in Russian for the pre-k through 3rd grade. This will involve learning the fundamentals of reading, writing and speaking Russian. This will be taught through stories, arts, writing, crafts, games, songs, food and play, swim lessons and little tikes basketball program.

Secondary- 4-7 grade The mornings will be spent with the home room teacher working on a project. The project will incorporate math, science, history, La, Art. there will be 1 hour of focused intentional study in which the students are literally taught for testing. russian language will be taught in the afternoon as a second language. Afternoons will also incorporate life skills such as archery, skiing, sewing, welding these will alternate with seasons and necessity. Basic food preparation, safety, dietary needs.

Diploma- 8-12 will begin working on a portfolio that will be part of their graduate with a world recognized diploma

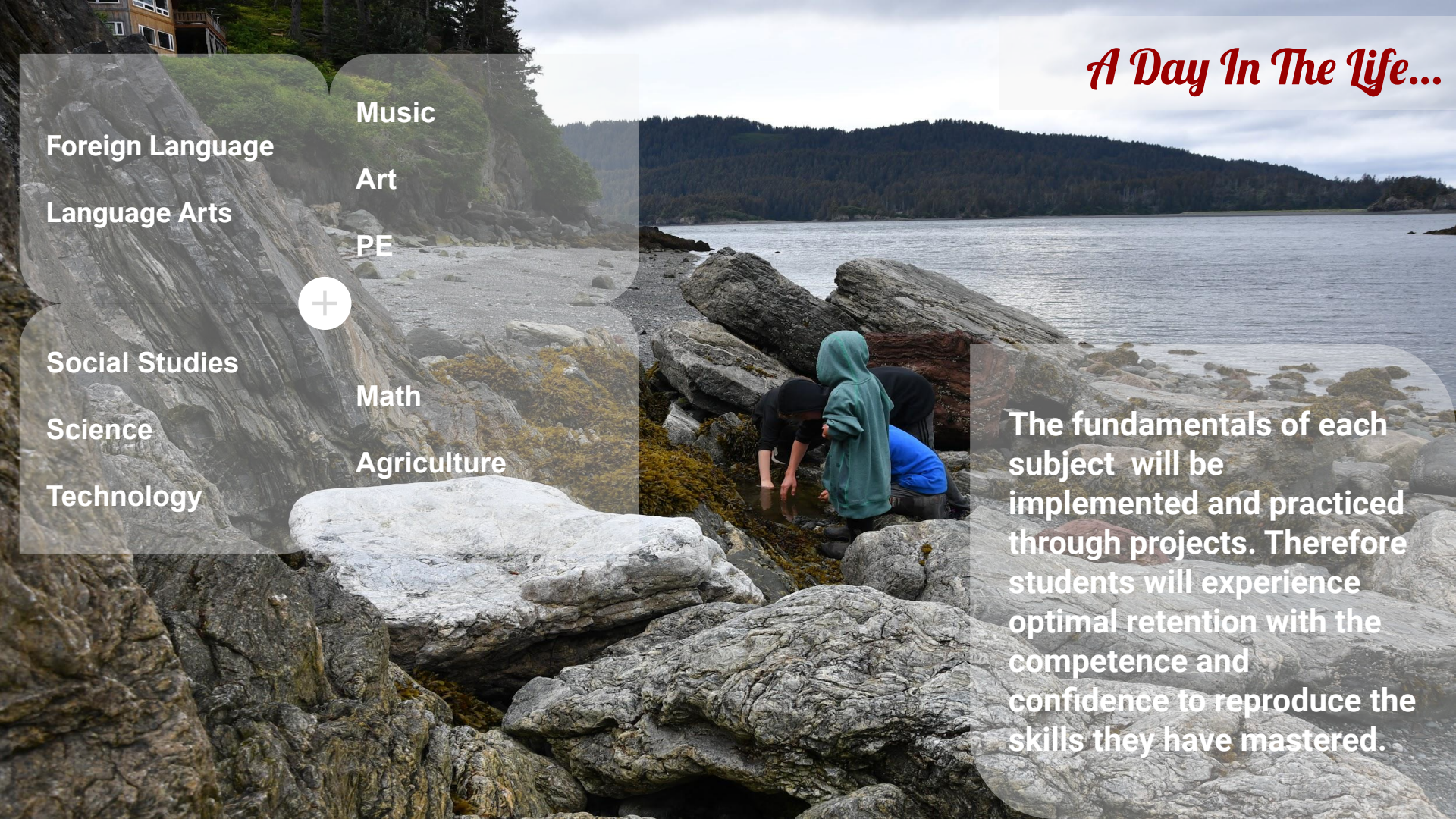
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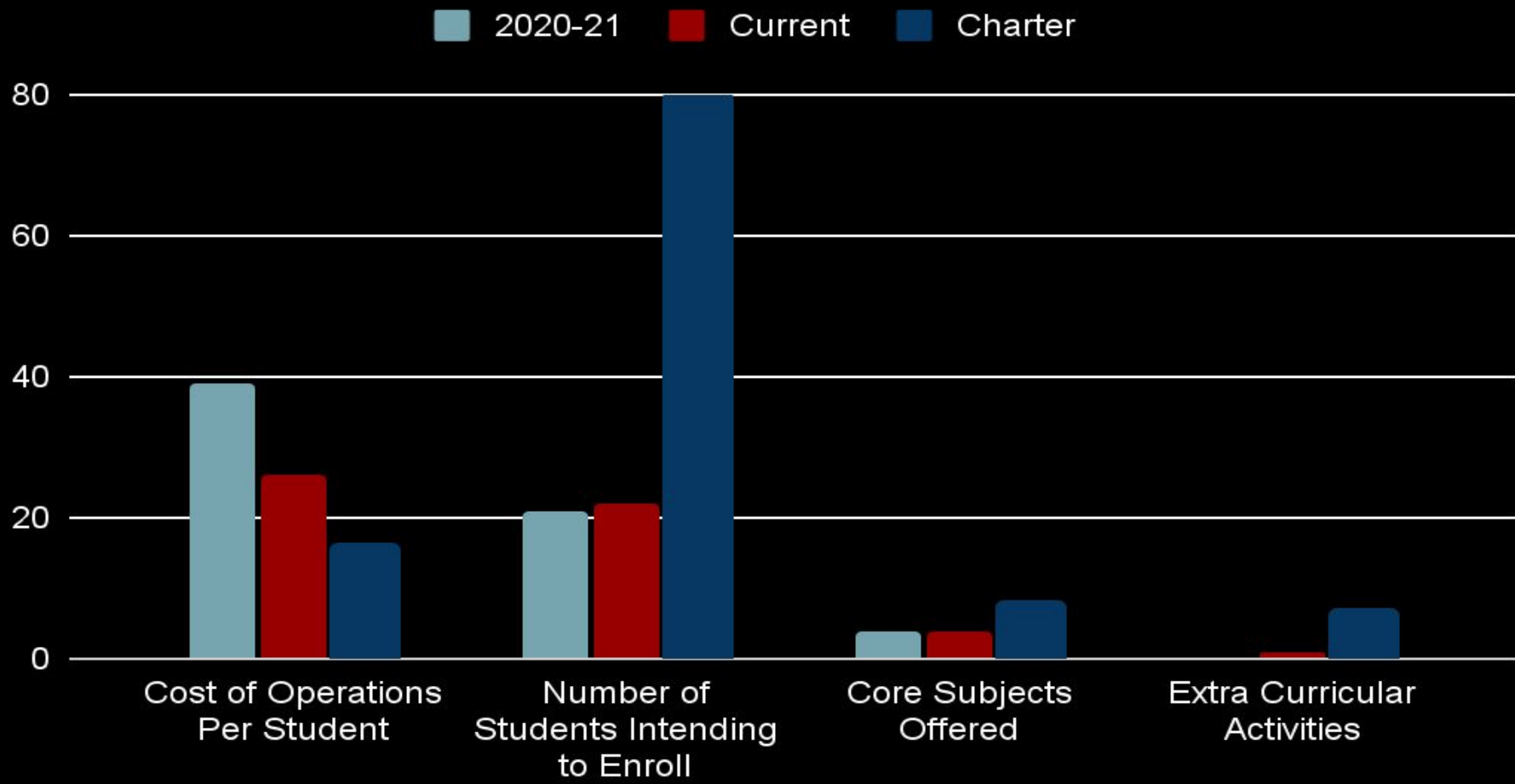

The fundamentals of each subject will be implemented and practiced through projects. Therefore students will experience optimal retention with the competence and confidence to reproduce the skills they have mastered.

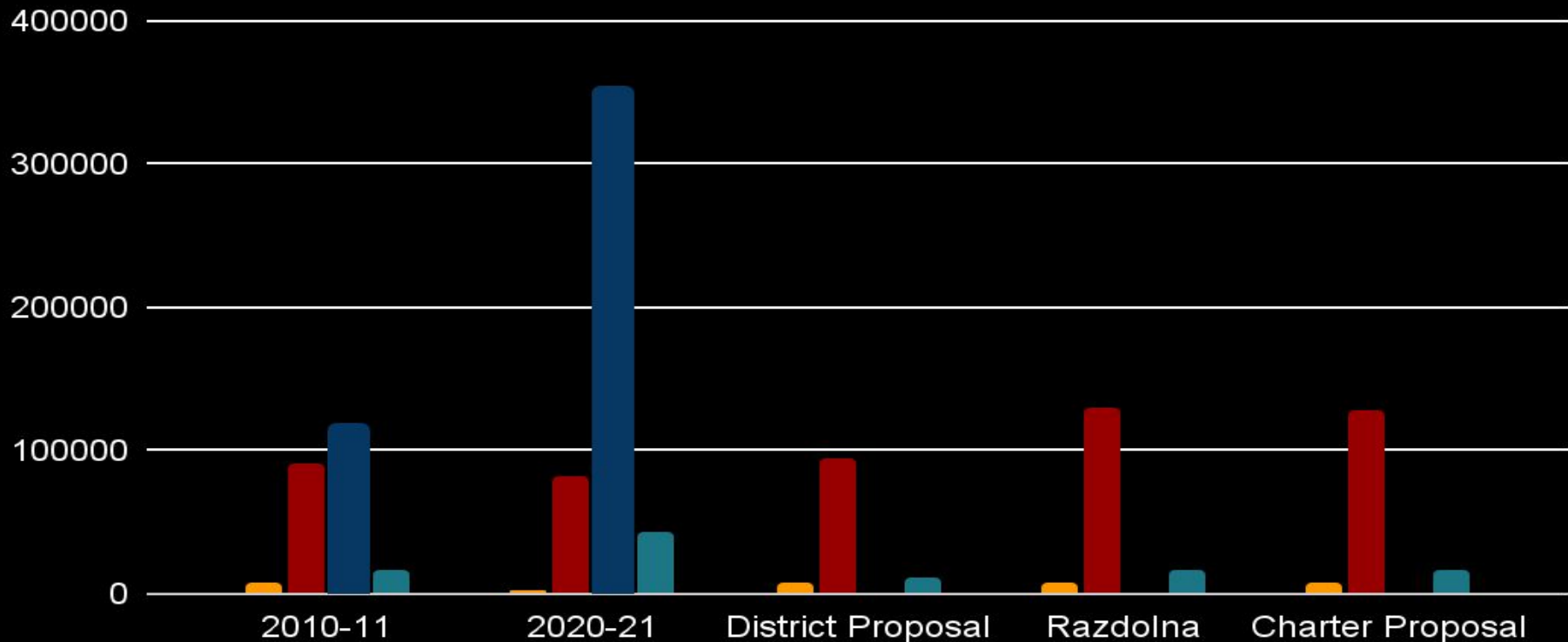


Nikolaevsk School Operation Comparison
