Weaknesses: Lack of room to expand activities. Lack of storage.

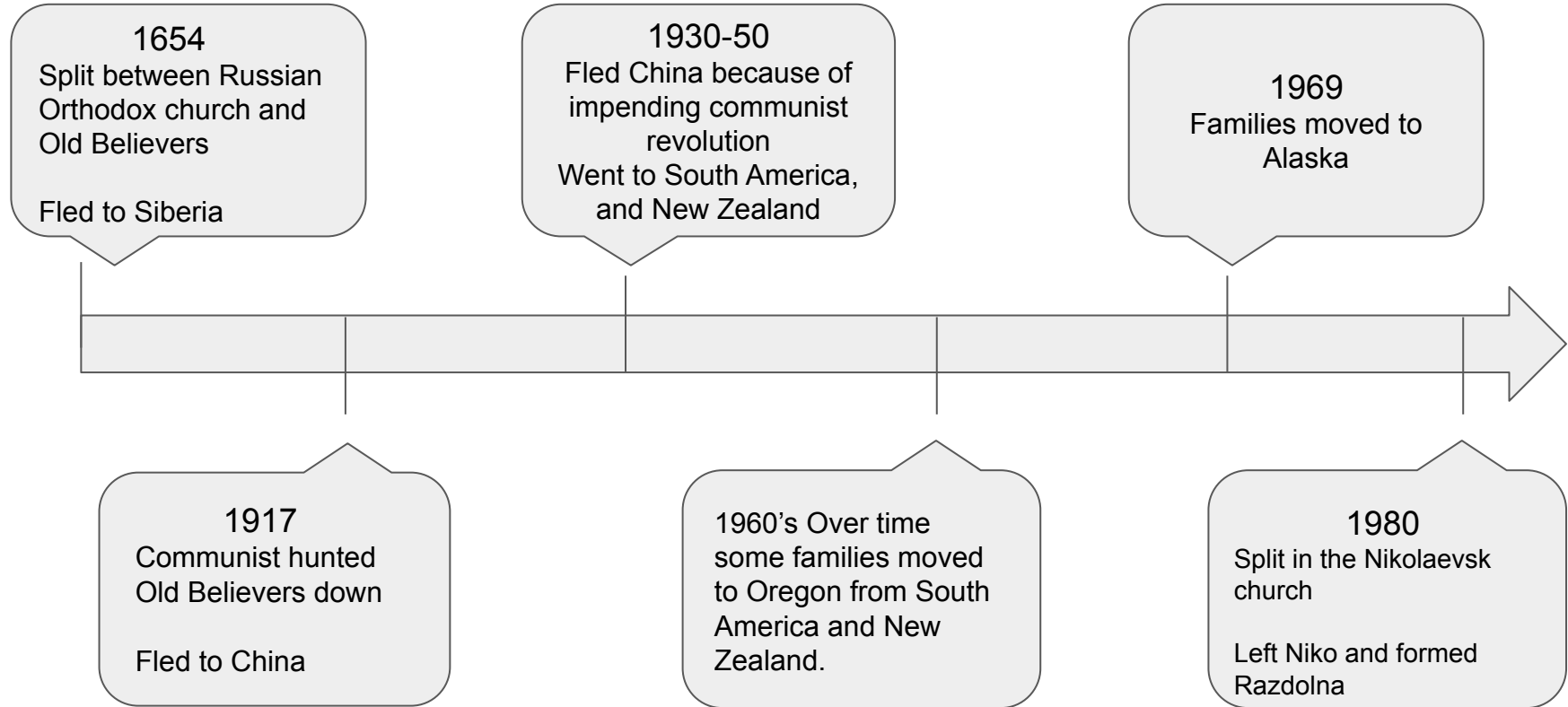
We lack what most borough owned buildings are required to have, for instance we don't have a gym. To mitigate this we utilize our surroundings and wilderness setting.

ВЛИНИ/БАЙНЫ

PREPPING TIME: 15 MIN

INGREDIENTS

- 10 eggs
- 2 tsp salt
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 2 cups flour
- 3/4 cups boiling water
- 1 stick butter

TIPS

- If batter is too thick for your liking or if you're having trouble spreading it add 1/2 or 1 cup of water.
- If you can't spread the batter fast enough lower the heat.

COOKING TIME: 1 HOUR

DIRECTIONS

1. In a mixer beat eggs, salt, and milk on a low speed.
2. Spoon in flour until combined.
3. Then slowly pour in the boiling water.
4. Prepare a plate roughly the size of your blini to transfer them once cooked. Find a ladle that will deposit just enough batter to lightly cover the bottom of the pan. And a spatula to flip it.
5. Let the pan warm up on medium heat and butter the bottom.
6. With one hand hold up the pan and with the other hand deposit a ladle of batter into the middle of the pan. Rotate the pan so the batter evenly coats the bottom.
7. Set the pan back on the burner and once the edges start to golden and become crispy, flip the blini.
8. Let the other side cook for a few seconds before transferring it to the plate.
9. butter the cooked blini.
10. Repeat

HISTORY

Blini were considered a symbol of the sun for its round shape. They were traditionally made for the last week before the Great Lent known as Maslitsa or "pancake week" to honor the new sun after the end of winter. Now they are very common all over the world.
