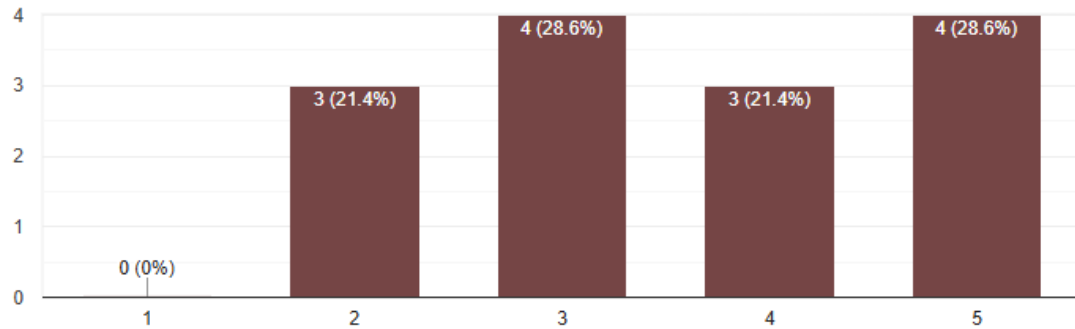

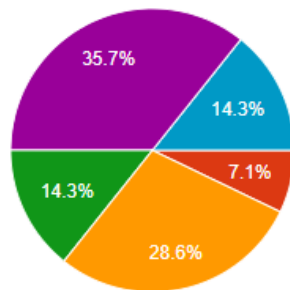

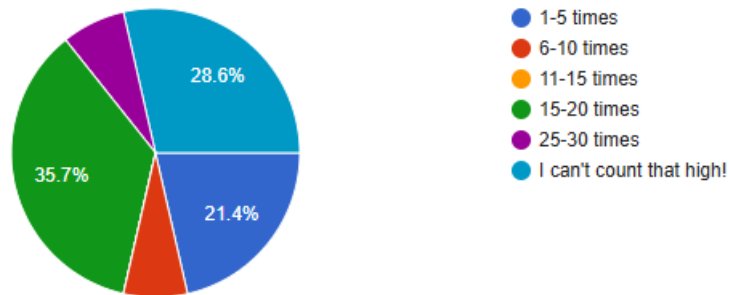


- None - No one was ever on a phone in my class last year.
